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Staying Safe Online

The most important thing we do is to keep children safe and sometimes the conversation around how we do that together with parents, is brought into sharp focus. Many of you will be aware of a recent surge in concerns over internet pop ups, and their capacity to impact on children significantly. As a staff, we have decided not to shine any spotlight on these horrible influences which are designed to harm...rather we would ask that parents simply pay special attention to what their children are viewing online and take steps to ensure they are not unsupervised when using the internet. In school, we have spoken at length with the children without going into any details. They know that if they stumble across anything which 'feels wrong' they must tell an adult. We would ask that parents do the same at home and, rather than fan the flames of media hype, just quietly take control of this scourge on childhood. Aspire have updated their internet safety pages, so do check out the website for signposts to useful organisations.

World Book Day – Thursday 7th March

Rather than use this day as an opportunity to dress up, we felt that we would like to shift the focus back onto our passion for reading. There are so many incredible books in the world – as many books as there are pebbles on a beach – as I told the children last week. Surely, we should celebrate our collective favourites!
