

Love Reading Journals

A beautiful conversation around our love of reading

What is the Love Reading Journal?

The "Love Reading" Journal records conversations, observations and connections between your child, you and their teachers in school around their "Reading for Pleasure" book.

What is the Reading for Pleasure book?

This is the carefully chosen book that they have picked from our library or our class book corner. This book is in addition to any Read, Write Inc or independent reader book that your child will also read daily to practise their fluency (the mechanics of reading).

Why do we have a Love Reading Journal?

It supports and encourage your child's commitment to reading. It shows your child how reading is valued and loved by the important people in their lives.



Never forget the pure joy in sharing a book together.

How to use the Love Reading Journal?

- In school: the children will be engaging with the Love Reading Journal weekly
- In school: the teacher will comment or ask questions weekly
- At home: parent/ carer to comment in the journal weekly
- At home: as part of their Home Learning English challenge a sticker with an activity will be stuck into your child's Love Reading Journal that will look like:

At the back of the journal, there are tips for how you can support your child and suggestions of how to answer these questions.

 In addition, you can also share responses to other beautiful books that you have read together. These might be from the local library, book shop or those lovingly passed on by friends and family.

E Safety

- Regular lessons on the importance of E-Safety and how to stay safe online.
 Children are taught to tell an adult if they see anything inappropriate, to keep passwords private and of the danger of sharing personal information online

Lessons happen on Wednesday and Friday afternoons- PE kits must only come in then. Swimming is in the Summer term.

For safety reasons, we cannot allow children to participate in PE lessons unless they are wearing appropriate clothing. If for any reason, you cannot bring in school PE kit, please temporarily provide a suitable alternative so your child can still join in their lesson.

Our PE kit expectations are:

- Sky Blue t-shirt
- Plain black shorts
- Plain black jogging bottoms
- Plain black sweatshirt
- Pair of comfortable, suitable sports trainers which can be tightly fastened and support their ankles. Trainers absorb impact and help prevent injury. They protect the ankles and fit around the whole foot, unlike plimsolls.
- Hair needs to be up (half up for shoulder length hair) and jewellery removed (or taped).

All children's PE kit must be clearly named and stored in a named bag.







Assessment


Ongoing daily and termly:

A variety of interventions will take place during the year and boosters will be offered for the Year 2 children closer to SATs time.



Although we encourage independence and responsibility, please check that your child has what they need and that it is labelled.
